The term BCE is used to refer the period of time that began before the birth of Jesus Christ. BCE is used in place of BC.

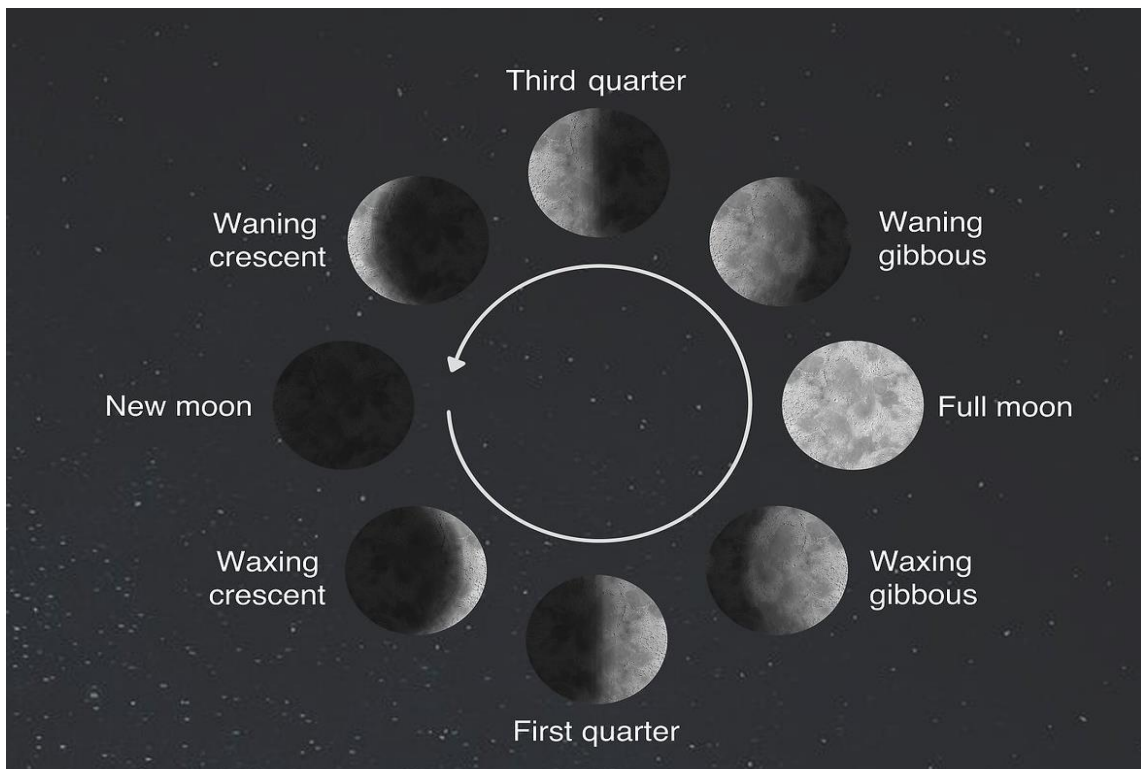
The term CE is used to identify the period of time that began after the birth of Jesus Christ. CE is used in place of AD.

<b>Lunar Calendar</b>	<b>Solar Calendar</b>
1. A lunar calendar follows the moon.	1. A solar calendar follows the sun.
2. There are roughly 354 days in the lunar calendar.	2. There are 365 days in a solar calendar year (366 days in a leap year).
3. A lunar calendar is based on the monthly cycles of the Moon's phases.	3. Solar calendar annual cycles are based solely on the solar year.
4. A lunar calendar tracks time using the monthly cycles of the moon's phases.	4. In a solar calendar, there is an extra day in February after every four years.
5. In a lunar calendar, there is an extra month after every three years	5. There is a roughly 11 days difference between solar and lunar years.
