Managing and controlling quality standards can be a daunting task when dealing with multiple suppliers and the possibility of quality variations.

Transportation and logistics

Transportation of agri-input products is a big factor that affects the time required for procurement, as well as the quality of products delivered to the supplier.

Disruptions to supply chain


Natural disasters, pandemics, and market fluctuations can disrupt the supply chain and create challenges for procurement management.

Company Name	Challenge	Solution	Result
McDonald's	Buying Food	Established direct relationships with suppliers and incorporated a commitment to sustainability.	The McDonald's supply chain reduced waste and costs, while supporting ethical sourcing.
Walmart	Buying Produce	Created a scorecard for suppliers to measure compliance with sustainability and incorporated long-term contracts for farmers.	Walmart reduced inefficiencies in the supply chain, increased the quality of the produce, and created long-term partnerships with suppliers.
