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

- These relationship include physician and patient attorney and client and clergy and counselee
- Under most circumstances privileged communication cannot be disclosed

Private rule :

protect private patient information

- 4.disclosure

Authorization

Permission given in order to share health information:
The following are the example of privileged
communication or in other words exception to the
general rule of professional secrecy





1.Infectious disease:

If a patient suffering from an infectious disease is employed as look or waiter in a hotel or a food handler with an enteric infection or a teacher with tuberculosis or other infection disease or as children nurse etc... He should be persuaded to leave the job until he become non-infectious

2.Notifiable disease:

A medical practicioner has a statutory duty to notify births deaths infection disease etc... to public health authorities.



3.Self-interest:

Both in civil and criminal suits by the patient against the doctor evidence about the patient condition may be given

4.Patient own interest:

The doctor may disclose the patient condition to some other person, so that he may be properly treated eg: to warm the paents or guardians of signs in the patient of melancholig, social tendencies etc





Patient rights:

- 1. Right to notice of private practices
- 2. Right to reguest confidential communications.
- 3. Right to request restrictions on certain uses of protected health information
- 4. Right to access a copy of protected health information
- 5. Right to request an amendment of health information
- 6. Right to receive in accounting of showing of health information





Every patient has right to:

- 1. Choose choose his own doctor freel
- 2. Acsess Age se religion economic & social status to emergency service
- 3. Dignity Treated with care compassion & respect
- 4. Privacy Treated in privacy during consulation & therapy
- 5. Confidentiality All information about his illness kept confidential





- 6. Information Receive full information about diagnosis investigation
- & treatment
- 7. Right to know Day to day progress line of action diagnosis prognosis
- 8. Refusal Right to consent or refused any specific for all measures.
- 9. Comfort To be treated in comfort during illness and follow up.
