



# POST OPERATIVE PROBLEMS PULMONARY EMBOLISM



 Usually present in second week but can present with sudden onset from 2nd to 4th postoperative period.



#### Signs & Symptoms:

- Dyspnea, substernal discomfort/chest pain, pleural pain, hemoptysis, tachycardia, increased cvp, hypotension and gallop rhythm
- X-ray chest may show linear shaddow, effusion or oligaaemia if embolous is large. ECG shows findings of right ventricular strain.
- Massive embolus may present as cardiac arrest.

#### *Treatment:*

• Prevent of deep vein thrombosis by Early ambulation Pneumatic compression of calf muscles



### Leg movements in bed Low dose heparin.



- For small embolous,anticoagulant may be sufficient
- For large embolous, streptokinase therapy should be instituted
- For massive embolous, resuscitation followed by surgical embolectomy may be considered.
