- Interactive bulletin board






PRINCIPLES

- Avoid overcrowded displays.

- Bulletin board may be placed wherever required on
- a classroom wall, in the corridor of the college, or

public building or at an information centre.





- •Bulletin boards work as a good supplement to normal classroom teaching .
- Bulletin board arouse students interest.
- •Bulletin board display can be used to introduce the topic and as well to review it.



DISADVANTAGES



- •Bulletin board cannot be used for all inclusive teaching.
- •Bulletin board has to be used only as a supplementary aid.
- •At times the collection of relevant material for certain specific topics may be difficult.

TYPES OF CARTOONS
