

## Unit - 3

### Introduction

If  $x$  &  $y$  are real numbers then  $z = x + iy$  is called a complex number where  $x$  is called real part of  $z$ ,  $y$  is called imaginary part of  $z$  and the value of  $i$  is  $\sqrt{-1}$ . The complex number  $x - iy$  is called the complex conjugate of  $z$  and it is denoted by  $\bar{z}$ . i)  $\bar{\bar{z}} = z$

Note:

1.  $|z| = \sqrt{x^2 + y^2}$

2.  $|z^2| = z\bar{z}$

3.  $z\bar{z} = x^2 + y^2 = r^2$

4.  $|\bar{z}| = |z|$

5. Real part of  $z = \frac{z + \bar{z}}{2}$

6. Imaginary part of  $z = \frac{z - \bar{z}}{2}$

7.  $z = re^{i\theta}$  is called polar form of  $z$

### Function of complex variable

$w = f(z) = u(x, y) + iv(x, y)$  where  $u(x, y)$  &  $v(x, y)$  are real variables.

### Analytic function

A function is said to be analytic at a point if its derivative exists not only at that point but also some neighbourhood of that point

### Cauchy - Riemann equations (Cartesian coordinates)

If the function  $f(z) = u(x, y) + iv(x, y)$  is analytic in a region  $R$  of the  $z$  plane, then

i)  $\frac{\partial u}{\partial x}$ ,  $\frac{\partial u}{\partial y}$ ,  $\frac{\partial v}{\partial x}$  and  $\frac{\partial v}{\partial y}$  exists

ii)  $\frac{\partial u}{\partial x} = \frac{\partial v}{\partial y}$  and  $\frac{\partial v}{\partial x} = -\frac{\partial u}{\partial y}$  at any point in region
