






What is president's rule in India?

- President's Rule, also known as Central Rule, is the suspension of the state government and the imposition of direct control by the President of India in a particular state. It is mandated by Article 356 of the Indian Constitution
- President's Rule is not a permanent feature but a temporary measure to bring back normalcy in a state.
- The period of President's Rule initially lasts for six months, but it can be extended in six-month increments up to a maximum period of three years, with the approval of both houses of Parliament.








When is President's rule is imposed?

- failure of the state government to function in accordance with the Constitution
- if the state legislature is unable to elect a leader as Chief Minister,
- Loss of majority in the assembly due to a vote of no-confidence in the house
- Elections postponed for unavoidable reasons like war, epidemic, pandemic or natural disasters.
- On the report of the Governor of the state if said state's Constitutional machinery or legislature fails to abide by Constitutional norms.







What happens when Presidents rule is imposed?

- Once President's Rule is imposed, the state's Governor becomes the constitutional head of the state, and the Governor's powers and functions extend to the whole state
- The Governor acts on the aid and advice of the Council of Ministers appointed by the President. The state's Legislative Assembly is either dissolved or suspended, and the Parliament assumes the legislative powers for that particular state.
