




The Passive Voice


A passive sentence consist of;

- \checkmark The past participle of the verb needed.
- \checkmark Sometimes, the agent and/or other complements
 - + verb + "to be" + Past participle

- The windows had been broken.

TENSE	ACTIVE
Present Simple	They speak German in Austria.
Present Continuous	They are planting some trees.
Present Perfect	Someone has eaten my muffin.
Past Simple	They closed the road for a day.
Past Continuous	He was not feeding his dogs.
Past Perfect	Someone had put out the fire before the fire brigade arrived.
Future Simple	They will fine you for littering.
Future with 'be going to'	They are going to raise taxes.
Modal verbs	You can solve the problem.
