Root: spect Meaning: see Examples: inspect suspect






AFFIXES



Affixes are word parts that change the meaning of a root or base word.

Prefixes and **Suffixes** are both **Affixes**. un+cook+ed=uncooked






PREFIXES



Prefixes are word parts (affixes) that comes at the **beginning** of the root word or base word.

Here,un+cook+ed=uncooked Prefix Affix



Prefix un+cook+ed=uncooked




SUFFIXES



Suffixes are word parts (affixes) that come at the end of the root word or base word.

Here,
un+cook+ed=uncooked Suffix Affix
