Future

SENTENCE STRUCTURE: S+V+O

- 1. Sun rises in the east.
- 2. If winter <u>comes</u> can spring be for behind.

- 3. A rolling stone gathers no mass.
- 4. The future <u>is</u> bleak to many young man.
- 5. <u>Is</u> there any mail for me today?

PRESENT CONTINUOUS TENSE

SENTENCE STRUCTURE: S+am/is/are+(V+ing)+O

- 1. The children <u>are just having</u> their breakfast.
- 2. We <u>are going</u> to Bombay next week.
- 3. They <u>are leaving for the USA on Sunday.</u>
- 4. The PM is coming to Chennai next Saturday.
- 5. When are you going to have your hair.

- 6. You <u>are always making trouble.</u>
- 7. I am getting up at 5'0 clock this week.
- 8. Students <u>are playing</u> football.
- 9. Micheal <u>is enjoying</u> with surya's movie.
- 10. They <u>are preparing</u> for the exam.

PRESENT PERFECT:

SENTENCE STRUCTURE: $S+has/have+(V+past\ participle)+O$

- 1. She <u>has just bought</u> (just buy) a typewriter.
- 2. My friends have left (leave), but I have decided (decide) to stay.
- 3. They do not trust him since he <u>has cheated</u>(cheat) them.
- 4. I have done (do) my best and the rest is god's will.
- 5. Many <u>have certified</u> (certify) that he is good cook.
- 6. We <u>have prepared</u> (prepare) well for the annual examination.
- 7. I <u>have never seen</u> (never see) such a mess in all my life.

PRESENT PERFECT CONTINUOUS:

SENTENCE STRUCTURE: $S+has/have\ been+(V+ing)+O$

- 1. We have been living here (live) since 1972.
- 2. I am sorry you have been looking(look) at the wrong side of the picture.
- 3. I have been standing(stand) in the hot sun for half an hour.
- 4. You have been avoiding(avoid) me for the past one month.
- 5. How long have you been wearing(wear) glasses?
- 6. That light has been burning(burn) all night.
- 7. He has been working(work) in bombay for 15 years.

SIMPLE PAST TENSE

SENTENCE STRUCTURE: S+V+O

- 1. He entered a room, took (take) off his coat and smiled at the guest.
- 2. The voice held (hold) the iron red firmly.
- 3. The liquid <u>froze</u> (freeze) at -15c as expected.
- 4. We went (go) to Mysore last week.

5. She <u>worked</u> (work) in GH for 10 years.

PAST CONTINUOUS

SENTENCE STRUCTURE: S+was/were+(V+ing)+O

- 1. I <u>was having</u> (have) many friends at college.
- 2. I _was reading (read) the novel when Ram came.
- 3. It <u>was raining</u> (rain) heavily, while he was passing through the garden.
- 4. The election <u>was repair</u> (repair) the faulty cable.
- 5. The blockage was stopped stop) the water from flowing freely.
- 6. I was watching (watch) TV when she called.

PAST PERFECT TENSE

SENTENCE STRUCTURE: $S+had+(V+past\ participle)+O$

- 1. He had studied (study) English before he moved to New York.
- 2. I had never seen (see) such a beautiful beach before I went to Kouai.
- 3. I did not have any money because I had lost (lose) the wallet.
- 4. He had spent (spend) three years in Tahit when he was a child.
- 5. She only understands the movie because she had read (read) the book.
- 6. I <u>had written</u> (write) a long letter to my mother yesterday.
- 7. I met (meet) him in New Delhi.

PAST PERFECT CONTINUOUS TENSE

SENTENCE STRUCTURE: $S+had\ been+(V+ing)+O$

- 1. The new machine had been running (run) for an hour when it started raining.
- 2. How long the player <u>had been played_(play)</u> before he scored a fifty.
- 3. It is already 9.30 pm and I <u>had been waiting</u> (wait) here for an hour Jason was tired because he had been exercising (exercise).
- 4. Sam gained weight because <u>he had been eating</u> (eat).

SIMPLE FUTURE:

SENTENCE STRUCTURE: S+will/shall+V+O

- 1. It will /shall rain (rain) tomorrow.
- 2. The teacher will be (be) on leave next week.
- 3. She will send (send) a gift for my next birthday.

- 4. The doctor will perform (perform) the operation tomorrow.
- 5. They will get (get) married next year.
- 6. They will arrive (arrive) in an hour.
- 7. America will wage a war next year.

FUTURE CONTINUOUS TENSE:

SENTENCE STRUCTURE: $S+will\ be+(V+ing)+O$

- 1. My mother will be cooking (cook) in the kitchen, when I go home.
- 2. Her father will be travelling (travel) in first class compartment tomorrow.
- 3. The prime minister will be going (go) abroad next month.
- 4. We will be learning (learn) English from next day.
- 5. You will be living in London soon.
- 6. I will be reading (read) a play tonight.

FUTURE PERFECT TENSE

SENTENCE STRUCTURE: $S+will\ have+(V+past\ participle)+O$

- 1. By this time, next year I will have prepared (prepare) to go abroad.
- 2. They will have graduated (graduate) by July 2008.
- 3. I <u>will have retired</u> (retire) by the end of the year.
- 4. We will have returned (return) home by 5'o' clock.
- 5. By tomorrow, their life will have changed (change) completely.

FUTURE PERFECT CONTINOUS TENSE

SENTENCE STRUCTURE: S+will have been+ (V+ing) +O

- 6. By July 2009, they will have been working (work) for this organization for three years.
- 7. The new factory will have been running (run) in this company for six years.
- 8. I (work) here for ten years next week.
- 9. He will have been talking (talk) for over an hour by the time Thomas arrives.
- 10. By the next November I will have been working (work) in this company for ten years.
- 11. He will be tired when he arrives. He will have been traveling (travel) for 24 hrs.
- 12. He will be tired because he will have been exercising (exercise) so hard.
