DEFINITE AND INDEFINITE ARTICLE

Definite and indefinite articles are types of determiners that are used before nouns to provide more information about the noun.

Definite Article: "The"

- The definite article "the" is used before a noun to refer to a specific item or group of items that are already known to the reader or listener.
- It is used when there is only one of something or when the noun is unique or clearly defined.
- Examples:
 - The cat is sleeping on the couch.
 - Have you seen the movie we talked about yesterday?
- 2. Indefinite Articles: "A" and "An"
 - The indefinite articles "a" and "an" are used before a non-specific noun or to refer to something for the first time.
 - "A" is used before words that begin with a consonant sound.
 - Example: I would like a cup of coffee.
 - "An" is used before words that begin with a vowel sound.
 - Example: She has an interesting story to tell.
 - The choice between "a" and "an" depends on the sound that follows the article, not the actual first letter of the word.
 - Example: A university (pronounced "you-niversity")
 - Example: An hour (pronounced "ow-er")
 - Remember, these articles indicate non-specificity or introduce something for the first time.
 - Example: I saw a cat in the yard. (Any cat)
 - Example: She wants to adopt an elephant. (Any elephant)
 - Certainly, sentences without articles are known as "zero-article" sentences. Here are some common cases where articles are typically omitted:
 - 1. Plural and Uncountable Nouns in General Statements:

Example: Dogs are loyal animals.

2. Languages and Academic Subjects:

Example: I'm learning French.

3. Names of Meals, unless Specific:

Example: I had dinner with my family.

4.	Titles and Occupations (when used generically): Example: Mr. Smith is President of the company.	
5.	Sports and Activities: Example: I play soccer.	
6.	Days, Months, and Holidays (when used generally): Example: I love Fridays.	
7.	Locations (Cities, Countries) used as Categories: Example: Paris is known for its art.	
8.	Time Expressions: Example: We met in the morning.
