Connectives and linking words are words or phrases that are used to establish connections, relationships, and transitions between ideas and sentences in a piece of writing. They help create coherence and flow in a text.

1. Addition:

Additionally, Furthermore, Moreover, In addition, Besides, Also Example: I enjoy hiking. Additionally, I love camping in the mountains.

2. Contrast:

However, Nevertheless, On the other hand, Nonetheless, But

Example: She is very talented. However, her work lacks experience.

3. Cause and Effect:

Therefore, Consequently, Thus, As a result

Example: The weather was bad; therefore, the flight was delayed.

4. Time:

Meanwhile, Meanwhile, Afterwards, Eventually, Simultaneously

Example: He finished his homework. Meanwhile, his sister was playing in the garden.

5. Comparison:

Similarly, Likewise, In the same way

Example: Dogs are loyal. Similarly, cats can also form strong bonds with their owners.

6. Emphasis:

Indeed, Certainly, Undoubtedly

Example: This is, indeed, a challenging task.

7. Illustration or Clarification:

For example, Specifically, In other words, To illustrate

Example: There are various animals in the zoo, such as lions, tigers, and elephants.

8. Conclusion:

In conclusion, To sum up, Therefore, Overall

Example: In conclusion, the project was a great success.

9. Sequence:

Firstly, Secondly, Finally, Next, Then

Example: Firstly, gather all the materials. Secondly, start the experiment.

10. Purpose:

To, In order to, So as to

Example: I went to the store to buy some groceries.

11. Certainty:

Certainly, Definitely, Surely

Example: She will certainly be there on time.

12. Contradiction:

On the contrary, conversely

Example: He thought she would be angry. On the contrary, she quite understood.
