- 3. Food Safety and Standards (Licensing and Registration of Food Businesses) Regulations, 2011: These regulations specify the procedures and requirements for obtaining licenses and registrations for various types of food businesses, including manufacturers, processors, distributors, and retailers.
- 4. Food Safety and Standards (Food Product Standards and Food Additives) Regulations, 2011: These regulations lay down the standards for various food products including their composition, additives, and labeling requirements.
- 5. Food Safety and Standards (Packaging and Labeling) Regulations, 2011: These regulations specify the packaging and labeling requirements for food products to ensure consumer safety and prevent misleading information.
- 6. Food Safety and Standards (Contaminants, Toxins, and Residues) Regulations, 2011:

- 7. Food Safety and Standards (Prohibition and Restriction on Sales) Regulations, 2011: These regulations prohibit or restrict the sale of certain foods or ingredients that are deemed unsafe or harmful to health.
