Imperative sentences are used to express command and give orders. Instructions should be clear, precise, and understandable.

Guidelines to write Imperative Instructions:

- * **Number** each of the instructions.
- * Always use **present tense** in the sentence
- * Start the sentence with **Action verb**
- * Complete the sentence with **full stop** (.) or an **exclamation mark** (!)
- * Use appropriate transition words such as 'first', 'next', 'then', 'finally', to show the sequence of action.

Example 1:

Write a set of eight instructions that could be followed by students in the examination hall.

- 1. Enter the examination hall atleast 10 minutes before the stipulated time
- 2. Carry only the hall ticket, pen, pencils, etc. that are required for the examination
- 3. Leave the mobiles and all other papers outside the hall
- 4. Sit in the seat with your registration number
- 5. Maintain strict silence after entering the hall
- 6. After the answer script booklet and question papers are issued, check to see whether all the papers are intact and the questions are clearly visible
- 7. Fill all the information on the first page of the answer script before answering the questions
- 8. Before submitting the paper, check whether you have answered all the questions.

Example 2:

The number of road accidents keep increasing day by day and many valuable lives are lost. Write a set of eight instruction to prevent road accidents.

- 1. Follow the traffic rules, and obey the signals
- 2. Wear helmet while riding a two-wheeler
- 3. Do not use cellphone while driving
- 4. Do not drink and drive
- 5. Adhere to the lane discipline
- 6. Do not try to overtake
- 7. Avoid rash driving
- 8. Use pedestrian cross and subways for crossing.
