*** Use 'U' after 'Q'**

Quarterly, Quality, Quantity, Earthquake, Equality, Queue, Quick, Question, Quest

*** Don't use 'S' after 'X'**

Excite, Excitement, Excellent, Exceed, Excessive, Excited, Exceptional, Excellence

*** Words Ending in 'ck'**

Word ending in /k/ uses /c/ before it.

rack, Check, Rack, Pack, Back, Hack, Tick, Chick, Stick, Stock, Neck, Kick

*** Use 'i' before 'e'**

Achieve, Belief, Believe, Chief, Thief, Grief, science

*** Some words use 'e' before 'i'**

Seize, Neighbour, Eight, weight, height, foreign

*** When a word has 'c' then use 'e' and 'i'**

Receive, Deceive, Receipt, etc...

* **Doubling - words ending in a consonant are doubled at the end.**

Plan - Planning
Drop - Dropped
Thin - Thinner
Occur - Occurred
Flip - Flipping
Shop - Shopping
Skip - Skipping
Stop - Stopped

Punctuations are used to convey the meaning of the sentence clearly. Some of the most commonly used punctuation marks are the follows:

1. Period (.)

* A full stop or period is used at the end of a complete sentence.

Its used to complete the sentence.

Ex: Zara dances well.

* Used after initials and abbreviations

Ex: M. John, K. Ram

Ex: No. 105, Std. , P.

2. Question Answer (?)

Its used at the end of direct questions.

Ex: Have you received any mail?

Where is my bag?

3. Exclamation Mark (!)

Used at the end of the word or phrase to indicate surprise, happy, sadness and strong emotions

Ex: Wow! This flower is so beautiful

Ouch! That hurts!

Oh no! I can't believe it!

Please help me!

4. Comma (,)

* Used to **separate items** in a list

Ex : I can speak Tamil, English and Hindi

* Used to **separate question tag** from the rest of the sentence

Ex: He sings well, doesn't he?

She is your sister, isn't she?

* Used to indicate a **pause between the** words, phrase, clause

Ex: "We will talk about it later," she replied.

* When an **adverb** is used in the starting of the sentence, use comma after it.

Ex: No, I would never do this.

Slowly, the rain stopped

Often, I visit temple

* Used to separate date, day, year

Ex: Monday, May 12, 2015

5. Semicolon (;)

* Used to **link two independent clauses** with similar ideas

Ex: She was still sick; she was constantly sneezing

* When two clauses are linked by **conjunctions** or **adverb**, use semicolon before it

6. Colon (:)

* It's used to introduce a list, explanation, example, dialogue

Ex: We should buy: butter, milk and sugar.

The world is a stage: play your role well.

Sarah: I'm not going to school today.

* Used to set off the main title from the sub title

Ex: Letter Writing : Business letter



Main title



Sub title

* Used with numbers to separate the **unit of time**

Ex: 04:50:53

7. Quotation mark (" ")

* It's used to indicate the **beginning** and **ending** of quote

Ex: He asked, "Why are you late?"

Ram said, "I want a cup of coffee".

* Used to enclose **title**

Ex: William Shakespeare wrote "Romeo and Juliet"

8. Parentheses [()]

* Used to enclose numbers or letters that make items in a list

Ex: There are two types of letters.

They are (i) Formal Letter (ii) Informal Letter

* Used to add **additional informations** in a sentence

Ex: Dr.Abdul Kalam (b.1931) is called as 'India's Missile Man'

9. Apostrophe (')

* Used to indicate **plural** of letters and numbers

Ex: In 1980's, he was a student.

* Used in **possessive case**

Ex: This is Jame's pencil

* Used to indicate **ownership**

Ex: King's castle is full of people

* Used in **contracted form**

Ex: He'll (he will), Can't (Cannot), Isn't (Is not)

10. Hyphen (-)

* Used to **separate parts of compound** numbers

Ex: Nighty - eight thousand

One - fourth of the total strength

* Compound nouns

Ex: Sister -in-law, Mother-in-law, Brother -in-law, Father -in-law.

* Used to separate some prefix from root words

Ex: Self-evaluation, Post-war, Self-employed

11. Capitalisation

* First letter of the sentence

Noise pollution is a serious problem

*First letter of quotation

Ram shouted. " **M**aintain Silence"

* For Proper Nouns like name, place, things

Harish, **I**ndia, **B**all

* '**I**' and '**O**' when used as a word.

When **I** reached home, **I** was surprised

" **O**, gentle breeze, take my message".

* Name of Months, days, special days,

Monday, Christmas, December

*Name of Mountains, Peaks, Planet, Building

Mount Everest, Earth, Nile waterfalls, Twin Towers

* Title of Books, newspaper, play, movie, series

Book - Language Book

Newspaper - The Hindu

Series - Money Heist

* Name of historical events

World War I, The Great War

* Words that refer to God, Religion, Group

Lord Shiva, Lord Jesus, Buddhism, Jains, Puritans
